This day personally appeared before me James M. Barber and made oath that in the year 1852 he belonged to the Volunteer Company Commanded by Capt. B. Bernard & that he attended & mustered in said Company during the whole Muster that year & that he has been fined for failing to muster in the Company of Capt. T. Poindexter for the entire muster of that year when he belonged & mustered in Capt. Bernards Company - Given under my hand this 1<sup>th</sup> May 1854
